





# Norris Jernigan

NORRIS N JERNIGAN was born June 11, 1925. He enlisted in the Army Air Corps. On June 10th 1943, the before his 18th birthday and served until March 17th, 1946. In May, 1944 he was assigned to the Intelligence Department of the 393rd Bomb Squadron, 504th Bomb Group (a new B-29 unit). In

August 1944 the 393rd Bomb Squadron was separated from the 504th Bomb Group and sent to Wendover, Utah., When the Squadron arrived at Wendover they were advised they had been selected to be the Bomb Squadron for the 509th Composite Group, a new and specially designed unit, which would be trained to use a new secret weapon and if its use is successful should shorten the war by at least two years.

The Magic Yarn Project was featured at the convention and many Leos and Lions participated to create wigs for childhood cancer patients.




